
Following the performance, Andre took the time to answer questions from students about tips for breaking into a competitive industry, his musical inspirations, and how to navigate the demands of success at such a young age.






Over the course of the week, students took part in a range of worthwhile activities including workshops in calligraphy and traditional cooking techniques, as well as a night-time safari.
